"When my child was picked to benefit from the free education at this school, it relieved me from the stress of thoughts and nightmare about my children going to follow my footsteps of not going to school" Mukashyaka Jeanine 23 years old is a single mother of two children. She has been doing this and that, but all in vain until CMM thought it wise to help her and her children.

I have no specific job that I can count on my survival but when my children goes to school I get no doubt that at one point my children will change my life style.

Gone are the days of walking Kilometers to get a school.

There are times I think of what young children went through before this school was built here. No wonder some of them would make an excuse of the long distance which would result into some of them drop out or not even minding going there at all.

Dancila Mutege 35 is amongst other parents that benefited from the school that was meant for young children who are ready to start their education journey. If I may recall, children used to walk at least up to 10km away from home to school but today it's just at the door step. The school is providing breakfast for all children that attend this school. It was always a problem to parents wondering if they can afford everyday breakfast but God work in his miraculous way we have now a school that is accommodating almost 100 children including orphans and vulnerable in this village but if possible whoever is concerned should think of its enlargement so that if they are done with nursery school they can enroll in primary at the same school. I attribute the good performance of my child and other to the management of the school that is supporting them in different ways.

The school came as a solution to many parents who wouldn't afford to send their children to schools because there were far from their home areas and they would not afford transportation said Mr. Martin Ruzigamanzi, education officer in Rugarama. The existence of this school has added much in the education sector including teachers trainings and local leaders in supporting education.

It was after this school in this area that children started their nursery education; many parents would wait for their children to turn seven years to send them to primary school because they were not able to walk that long distance between their homes and school.

As young as they are, children are able to construct English sentences which is unusual to many primary students here, he added.

The management of the school should think of how they can increase the number of students and they go to primary level as well because they are doing a wonderful job of educating the future leaders of our country.

According to Mr. Mugemana, the church didn't not only touch the souls and left behind the body, we have been training people how they can take a good care of themselves since even our God is an organized

Lord. Our body being the temple of God we have to walk out talk, this has helped the church to draw many people to the throne of God.

People have been testifying how their lives have changed but the most encountered testimonies are people who have been drunkards and people who are infected with HIV/AIDS how they used to live and the new experience of life they are enjoying today. He added It is visualized that the Church has great impact to the community where by many people turns from bad behaviors, like drunkenness, and it has good impact on reducing the spread of HIV/AIDS and crimes are being minimized. Mr. Augustine Ngirabatware a widower and a father of five and living with HIV/AIDS

From a weekly saving of 500 frw it has changed my life style says Ngirabatware. Mr. Augustine Ngirabatware a widower and a father of five his life was in bad state not until he met God sent people to encourage him on how he can change his life style and live a positive life with HIV/AIDS

In 2007 we started collecting 200 frw but after sometime madam Oliver came to us and she gave advice on the best way to do it. The first thing she taught us was to trust in our Lord and our savior, since even our God encourages people to work, Oliver encouraged the member of Humura association to form a group of saving 500-2500frw weekly and loaning among ourselves and be able to solve our problems in this way, we are benefiting than we used before.

Under the loan system the group lent me 30.000 rwf

Which I used to buy sorghum and bean seeds which I planted and after harvesting I managed to repay back the

loan and the interest. Our savings group also gave me money that helped Me the time I was sick and not only me, another Group of seven people from our group were also given that money too. Currently we have about 1,000,000rwf in our case and we will share the money in December

This group has helped us to meet and share different ideas as we have in people with different life experiences and not only that some are counselors So we are no longer isolated because of God's love, my life today would have been different from what I am today."Ngirabatware being one of the beneficiaries he is also infected with HIV Aids.

He used to drink local alcohol and beers and he wasn't concerned in any way about his future and his family.

I would wake up just thinking where I will get someone to buy me a beer since I wasn't working it meant to move around the centre befriending people so that they can buy me one. He narrates.

I thank God that today I am able to work for my family and God bless these people who helped me if I may say they picked me near my grave yard.

Facts about HIV/AIDS in Africa.

Sub-Saharan Africa is more heavily affected by HIV and AIDS than any other region of the world. An estimated 22.9 million people are living with HIV in the region - around two thirds of the global total.1 In 2010 around 1.2 million people died from AIDS in sub-Saharan Africa and 1.9 million people became infected with HIV. Since the beginning of the epidemic 14.8 million children have lost one or both parents to HIV/AIDS. (UNAIDS (2010)

This project in Ntende has many possibilities and growth potential to even neighboring villages. As representing KIT, I am proud of this project and admire the energy of the CMM staff. The goal of the project in Ntende Village in Rwanda is to support pre-school education for 50-300 children between 3-7 years, and to support 120-400 children in primary school to stay in school and improve their educational performance. The project offers direct education to pre-school children, scholastic material and homework support to children attending the nearby primary school. The school is placed in a renovated building in Ntende Village, and the building is also used as office facilities for CMM, community meetings, HIV/AIDS counseling, youth clubs and other activities in the afternoon and in the evening. Drainage facilities and a water tank that collects water from the roof have been added to the building, and the compound also hosts a playground for children. DMCDD has supported the project with funds from Danida and the project will be implemented from 2011-2014. The community in Ntende is very much involved in the project due to the commitment of CMM and its volunteers, and CMM has also established a very good working

relationship with the nearby primary school. DMCDD is very pleased that the children in Ntende can have a good start in their education, and for the encouragement and assistance that CMM provide to the children so they can improve their educational performance.
